### August Worship Sermon Series .... Five Means of Grace - Receiving God's Divine Love



#### The Importance of Connection

This Sunday I'm continuing my sermon series on the Five Means of Grace. One of those means of grace is our own Christian Community. That means we each receive the love of God in our lives by relating to other Christians and by our connections with the church.

United Methodists love the word "connection." Wesley often called his conference "The Connection." The word connection implies that we are not just a group of people gathered together in one place but that we are also spiritually connected to each other. In connection we offer each other support, love, friendship, and God's grace. We offer each other companionship for the journey we are on together.

Early in my ministry I had a new youth worker who thought all of youth work should be some serious spiritual endeavor where most of the group's time would be spent in prayer and reflection. Soon youth were not attending. Why? They were not having fun, they did not know each other well, and so all the serious prayer was just awkward.

I shared with this new leader that fun and enjoyment were also part of our connection together. You tend to open up and share with people you know and enjoy being around. You share with people you have built relationships with. So those fun events like a pizza party or a youth outing are a waste of time. Instead, they are an opportunity to build better friendships and better relationships.

Coming on September 8<sup>th</sup> we are going to kick off with two special connection events! We will start with a Ministry Expo on Sunday morning, where we can learn about all our ministry activities and how we all can be involved and make connections through ministry. Sunday evening, we will be having a FALL KICKOFF event from 6:00-8:00pm with food, live music and fellowship sponsored by Adult Ministries, Element 412 Youth and Refuel. This fun-filled event will allow us all to spend time together in Christian connectionbuilding as we come together to celebrate God's love.

I hope that you will take the time to connect with Asbury UMC at both of these events because Christ connects us together!

## Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team How to Decide Between Urgent Care, Virtual Care or ER

- Primary Care is through your own physician and usually requires an appointment. This is always an option and is most used for regular checkups since you will be making an appointment in advance.
- Walk-In Care is a great option when you need care but can't wait to be seen by your primary care provider. Walk-in care treats minor stuff like coughs, small injuries, ear infections, fevers, non-severe burns or sprains, yeast infections, urinary tract infections, etc. Different locations have different hours, so check ahead first. You can save your spot online before going in to reduce wait time.
- Virtual Urgent Care is done from home and can be used to treat cold and flu, rashes, sore throat, headaches, sinus infections, allergies and more.
- Emergency Care is for life-threatening conditions including excessive bleeding, broken bones, chest pain or trouble breathing. Emergency services include diagnostic testing and access to specialists.

**REMINDERS:** If you or someone in your family is in the hospital, please call the church office or Carol or Cheryl to let us know. The hospitals **DO NOT NOTIFY US** when you are there! We want to come to see you, but you must let us know if/when you are hospitalized.
