JESUS REVEALED THE LAM STATEMENTS IN THE GOSPEL OF JOHN

"I AM WHO I AM"

This week we will begin a series of messages about the "I am" sayings of Jesus. In the Old Testament (Hebrew scriptures) God revealed himself to Moses. Moses asked God for his name, believing he needed a name to give to the children of Israel. For those who had been following God, God was identified as "The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob." When God was asked for a name he said, "I am who I am." Tell them my name is "I am." From this phrase, the people of Israel came up with the name of God which is found in the Bible as YHWH (or YHVH) which Christians

would instead just call God "Lord" (Adonai) rather than say the name as written in scripture.

Believers in Christ have been given additional names for God in the form of our Holy Trinity. We are blessed to call God "The

sometimes translate as Yahweh or Jehovah. The Israelite people never pronounced the name, as it was considered too holy; so they

Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team Six More Shortcuts to Meet Your 5-a-Day Quota



Easy Ways to Eat More Fruits and Veggies

- 1. **Start smart.** Make it a habit to order a salad or vegetable-based soup when you're out at restaurants. These fiber-rich starters may keep you from overeating when your meal comes, in addition to helping you add more vegetables into your day.
- 2. Bag it up. It may be more expensive to buy pre-chopped lettuce mixes, but they are quickly ready for lunch or dinner salads.
- 3. **Use the freezer.** Don't let those extra fruits and veggies rot in the fridge! Stock the freezer with fruits/veggies that you can't consume on time and use them in smoothies or for dinner sides.
- 4. **Pack portable produce.** Baby carrots chopped broccoli and celery sticks are great for munching anywhere. Dried fruits, like raisins and prunes, are easy to have on hand for a quick snack, too.
- 5. **Chop them up.** Shred carrots and zucchini or finely dice onions, peppers and spinach to hide in pasta sauces, hamburger patties, omelets and casseroles.
- 6. **Find the ones you love.** While you should aim for a wide variety of fruits and vegetables in your diet, don't hesitate to stick to the handful you love. You are much more likely to choose to eat those you enjoy!
