The Religion of Love

The following quote from John Wesley was recently posted by a friend on Facebook:

"What religion do I preach? The religion of love; the law of kindness brought to light by the gospel. What is it good for? To make all who receive it enjoy God and themselves: to make them like God; lovers of all; content in their lives; and crying out at their death, in calm assurance 'O grave, where is thy victory! Thanks be unto God, who giveth me the victory, through my Lord Jesus Christ." ~ John Wesley (An Earnest Appeal to Men of Reason and Religion, 19.11.54)

This quote from John Wesley is a reminder of the purpose of the gospel we teach and preach as United Methodist Christians. The gospel of Jesus is about love. It is about the love of God. We are told that we should love God with all our heart, mind, soul and spirit.

But what is the purpose of this love of God? To teach others to love God and to love each other. We truly believe and preach that our faith as Christians is primarily about love. The Bible says that God is love and in God there is no darkness.

Conversely, this means that any actions towards God or another human being that is not motivated out of love is not of God.

I have often been spiritually and theologically pained when I see a Christian leader from some faith group act as if the God we serve is an angry God, or a vengeful and wrathful God. As Christians, we believe that views of the Bible which make God out to be angry all the time are an incomplete picture of God. Who God is was made clearer in the life of Jesus. Jesus showed all people love. He showed love to the needy, to the poor, to the gentile, the Jew and the stranger.


