Son of God and Son of Humanity

We are in the midst of the Advent Season as we prepare to celebrate Christ's birth. One of the reasons we celebrate this season is to remind ourselves of the mystery of Jesus' incarnation.

As Christians we believe that Jesus was both human, the child of Mary, but also that Jesus is the divine son of God. Why does this matter? Because Jesus was human he experienced all the joy, stresses and sorrows of life. He was born into a family that had to work hard to survive. He grew up knowing that life was not easy. So Jesus understands us and what we go through day by day.

But also Jesus is divine. Jesus, as the son of God, can offer God's forgiveness and pardon. He can offer God's grace and love. He offers his very self as a victory over sin and death bringing to all of us eternal life.

If Jesus was only human, he could be a prophet but not our savior. If he were only divine, he could never have sacrificed his life for us.

When we think about Jesus born in a manger we think about the joy of new life. But, even from the beginning, Mary was told that Jesus was going to be the Messiah, the leader of his people. So, even from his birth, she was pondering in her heart the sacrifices he and his family would make in the years to come.

So, in Christmas, we celebrate the birth of Jesus, not just a beautiful child, but also the redeemer of the whole world!

Asbury United Methodist Church- 2025 Goals

These goal statements were drafted during the October Leadership Retreat and represent months of reviewing our progress toward our 2024 goals and then developing statements to guide Asbury's way forward for the coming year.

- 1. Continue to strengthen and expand our Children and Youth Ministries by engaging our youth in church activities and promoting our children and youth programs.
- 2. Engage current members in the 35 to 60 age range to help develop and implement strategies for church membership growth within that target demographic group.
- 3. Evaluate our annual pledge-based giving approach to consider other committed and intentional giving options.
- 4. Revise, implement, and communicate a "Safe Sanctuary" policy.
- 5. Explore options to reconfigure the Chancel space to be more effective and convenient to use.
- 6. Plan and execute a successful 75th Anniversary year of events, including Celebration Sunday on May 4th, 2025. (Establish Steering Committee by end of 2024.)
- 7. Strengthen our leadership development programming for the next generation of Asbury leaders.

Asbury United Methodist Church Marriage Policy

This statement follows more than a year of discussions with the Asbury congregation, analysis of a CAT survey, and prayerful discussion within the Leadership Team. In keeping with recent changes to the Book of Discipline and Iowa Annual Conference guidelines, the role of church leadership is to determine the use of the church property. All decisions about marriage and the marriage ceremony rest with the pastor.

Recognizing any UMC Pastor's individual discretion to perform any legal marriage ceremony, and also recognizing that Bettendorf Asbury United Methodist Church has always been and will continue to be a welcoming and inclusive faith community -- The Asbury Church Council affirms that Pastors may conduct any marriage ceremony in the sanctuary or on the Asbury property.
