## A HOLY LENT



In just a week, we will be entering the Lenten Season. Lent may be one of the most misunderstood seasons of the Christian year. Some people think that the main focus of Lent is to be sad or somber. But that's a misunderstanding of the season.

Like Advent, Lent is a season of preparation. In Lent we are preparing for Easter. In the Lenten Season we are looking at the life and teachings of Christ which led to Jesus' sacrifice for us on the cross. We are remembering and reminding ourselves that we need Jesus. Yes, we are sinners and part of Lent is recognizing that. But the purpose of Lent is not to dwell on our sin, but instead to celebrate that Christ's life and ministry overcomes sin and death.

Ash Wednesday begins Lent. On March 5th we will gather at 6:30pm for the imposition of ashes and for Holy Communion. The ashes are to remind us that we are mortal and that eternal life is found in Jesus Christ alone. Communion retells the story of Christ's sacrifice and Christ's victory.


Some people choose to give up something for Lent. If you feel led to do that, it is a good spiritual discipline. But even better, I would suggest you do something for Lent to serve others. Lent is a perfect time for deeds of kindness. Lent is a perfect time to pray for the world and others. Lent is also a good time to re-examine the loving and redeeming teachings of Jesus Christ and joyfully recognize that he is the source of our salvation!


Lent is a season of 40 days plus the Sundays. The Sundays are actually not part of Lent because every Sunday of the year is a celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. In these 40-plus days we will have special opportunities of worship on Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. We are also blessed to join together in a study of the last days and hours of Jesus' Life as we study "24 Hours that Changed the World" together.

## Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team SENIOR LIVING COMMUNITIES

(Research from University of Chicago)

Older adults have many options for their housing and care. Some choose to age at home, while other prefer or need services provided by one of the many types of senior living communities. People in Senior Living:

- Experience Decreased Vulnerability Older adults become more vulnerable to adverse health outcomes, but this vulnerability levels off and declines shortly after moving in.
- Receive More Healthcare Services Receive more care from providers than in their home, including more primary services and more visits from specialty providers such as podiatrists, psychiatrists and cardiologists.
- <u>Have Increased Longevity</u> Those who are in senior living generally have a lower mortality rate than those living in the community. They also receive more in-home healthcare, and obtain more days of home-based preventative and rehabilitative services.
- Experience Better Health Outcomes These individuals experience lower rates of inpatient hospital admissions.
