

Letting God Guide Us

The Lenten journey of 40-plus days is about learning to let God guide us. Most of the time we think that we are in charge of our own lives and that we decide what our future will be. But the truth is that only God knows the future and that, as Christians, we should be seeking God's guidance.

"There's a story from the 9th Century of three Irish monks who set sail in a coracle, leaving their oars behind. They washed up on the shores of Cornwall and were taken before King Alfred, who asked them where they came from. The monks said that they "had stolen away, because they desired, for love of God, to be in a state of pilgrimage, they recked not where." [The Anglo-Saxon Chronicle. Longman, Green, Longman, and Roberts, 1861. The Upper Room March 2021.]

These monks got in a boat and set sail without oars, so that they could just let the wind take them where God wanted them to go. Their answer to being dependent on God's guidance was to first let go of the notion that they were in control of their lives, so that they could let God be in control.

They wanted to "be in a state of pilgrimage" where God would lead them in directions they had not chosen or considered. To places "they recked no where."

For us to follow God during this Lenten season, we have to first dispel ourselves of the myth that we control our lives and the world around us, and choose to seek total dependance on God. When the monks did this, they found themselves led to the beautiful shores of Cornwall and to a place and ministry they could not have imagined.

In this Lent, may we be intentional about letting God lead us. May we remember that God can only guide us when we give up trying to choose our own direction without God's guidance.

Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team Remembering Our History

Kathy Troyer started the Parish Nurse program in 1999. She had heard about the program and did a presentation to Dale Batcheler, who was our pastor at that time. He approved the program. She started at 10 hours a week and after a short time went to 20 hours a week. Kathy wrote many policies for the church that were health-related, including policies for the nursery, fire evacuation and visiting with others. After taking the Parish Nurse Program offered by Trinity Hospital, Kathy started the Asbury Caring Congregation Team who did visits to shut- ins. In addition, she offered some education classes on health-related topics. Kathy was in this position for approximately 6 years and left when her husband was transferred for his job.
