### These Holy Days

We are just a couple of weeks away from Holy Week as we prepare for Easter. Holy Week is the week beginning with Palm Sunday. In this week we concentrate even more directly on the last days and hours of Jesus' life.

On Palm Sunday we celebrate the event at the beginning of the last week of Jesus' life on earth, when he rides into Jerusalem and people welcome him as they would welcome a king, shouting "hosanna" and "blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

On Maundy Thursday we celebrate Jesus' institution of the sacrament of Holy Communion. The day is called Maundy Thursday because the word Maundy comes from a Latin word that means "commandment." It is on this night that Jesus commands his Disciples to love one another. He exemplifies this love by washing his disciples' feet.

Later that evening, Jesus is betrayed by Judas Iscariot in the Garden of Gethsemane and is tried and convicted of crimes which are not clear, because he committed no real crime.

In several church traditions, though not often used in the United Methodist Church, the days from Thursday evening to the Resurrection on Sunday are known as the "Holy Triduum." The three holy days.

On Good Friday Jesus is crucified, sacrificing his life for all humanity. Jesus asks God to forgive his abusers saying, "forgive them, they know not what they do."

From Good Friday evening to Holy Saturday is a period of profound silence. Good Friday is the only day on the Christian calendar when you do not partake of Holy Communion. Often sanctuaries are stripped bare in mourning. The darkness of Good Friday and Holy Saturday, just before Christ's resurrection, reminds us that often it does seem darkest before the dawn. Often when it seems the most hopeless, is when the light comes.

Easter Sunday begins with the women who followed Jesus returning to the tomb and finding it empty, guarded by angels heralding his resurrection. Easter Sunday begins the fifty days of the Easter Season known in the Church as "The Great Fifty Days", when Jesus is seen by numerous people in resurrection appearances.

Asbury UMC will celebrate these holy days with worship as usual on Palm Sunday. We will have a Maundy Thursday service at 6:30pm, including Holy Communion served with the assistance of our confirmands. We will celebrate Good Friday together at 6:30pm with a special Taize meditation service.

I hope you'll join us for as many of these special holy celebrations as you can, as we celebrate with wonder and joy that Christ did all of this to bring us new life, salvation, and a hope-filled future!

## Bits and Pieces from Your Parish Nurse Team Remembering Our History

Kathy Troyer began the Parish Nurse program in 1999. She developed programs and provided educational meetings in her 5 years in the position. In 2000, Brenda Sherrick joined the program on a part-time basis. Brenda carried on with the programs Kathy had developed and was joined by Carol Jackson in 2012. Together they began visiting individuals in senior care facilities and in their homes in a purposeful pattern to stay more frequently in touch with those individuals. Brenda and Carol shared responsibility for visiting with congregants in the hospital, doing blood pressure checks and being a primary resource to all regarding health issues and living situations. Brenda added a Grief Share program in the years before her retirement in 2023. Cheryl Ewert joined the program in 2020 as a Health Care Advocate. Carol and Cheryl have added several dimensions to the program: Hands Only CPR Training, serving on the Prayer Team, senior living information, dementia information programs, a monthly foot clinic, hosting four blood drives each year, and funeral luncheon coordination. The Grief Share program continues also.
